Reminders

Tis the season....so please dress your child for the weather! A warm coat or layers, and now that the weather has turned colder, please remember to send mittens, hats, and boots to school with your child. An extra pair of socks, or sweatpants would also be advisable. This will save you from getting the call, "Hi Mom/Dad I'm wet; can you bring me some dry clothes?" Placing socks, underwear and extra clothes in your child's backpack is strongly encouraged.
